

Answering the Call to Serve, Together

South Sudan faces overlapping emergencies that threaten the health and well-being of countless families. But your generosity is preserving hope for so many. Because of your steadfast belief in our mission, our work continues during these unprecedented times—preventing suffering, restoring health, and saving lives.

When fighting erupted in South Sudan earlier this year, families were forced from their homes. This past June, we witnessed the consequences of such displacement when a group of 89 people, mostly women and children, arrived at a displacement camp in Yambio.

Violence had pushed them on a grueling two-month journey through South Sudan's wilderness to seek refuge. They brought with them only what they could carry.

CMMB and partners came together to assess the needs of families—thanks to you, just as we are able to do in other times of crisis. We screened these families for malnutrition and HIV and replaced medications left behind in the rush to escape. Many of the internally displaced people we assessed were pregnant or breastfeeding. We also distributed water purifying sachets to provide clean water for drinking and help stop the spread of the deadly cholera outbreak sweeping the country.

Your support is saving lives in South Sudan and around the world. Because of you, families are getting the care, medicine, and safe water they need to survive. Your kindness reminds them—and us—that even in the darkest moments, compassion is the base of a better tomorrow.

Regaining Hope in Haiti

In Haiti, a heartbreaking crisis continues. Armed gangs have held their grip on Port-au-Prince and the surrounding areas. Many families have chosen to leave, seeking safety in remote communities like Côtes-de-Fer, where CMMB serves.

A mother of three, Lydia, had moved to Haiti's capital in search of a better future. She lived there peacefully for nearly two decades—until 2024, when escalating insecurity reached her neighborhood.

She relocated once, then again, but each time the violence followed. In May, Lydia returned with her children to her hometown of Côtes-de-Fer. Starting over was not easy, but thanks to you, she did not need to do it alone.

Lydia joined a Mothers' Club—an initiative supported by CMMB and made possible by your generosity. Led by community health workers, these clubs equip women with knowledge to care for their families and explore economic opportunities.



Since joining, Lydia has completed all 16 of the club's health and wellness sessions, graduating at the top of her group. She now uses what she learned to protect her family's health and has started selling soap at the local market to support them.

Lydia shared that she is grateful for the opportunity to learn—an experience that helped her regain hope and confidence after so much uncertainty.
